

Session 102 | Palomino E Ian Hooper, Alberta Human Services

Partnerships in Injury Reduction

Partnerships in Injury Reduction is a non-regulatory, province wide injury prevention program sponsored cooperatively by government, labour, and industry. The program offers tools to:

- Implement a health and safety management system
- Guidance in applying for a Certificate of Recognition (COR)
- Potential for premium rebates from the Workers' Compensation Board-Alberta

In this session, Ian Hooper, Director of Alberta Human Services, OHS Branch - Partnerships in Injury Reduction, will provide an update and overview of the Partnerships program and its initiatives.

Session 103 | Palomino F David Antle (sponsored by ACE)

'Participatory Ergonomics' Approaches to Develop Applied Workplace Research and Effective Workplace Interventions.

Participatory Ergonomic (PE) Approaches enhance ergonomic interventions by harnessing employee knowledge, improving communication among stakeholder groups, developing improved buy-in among stakeholders, and developing sustainable capacity. However,

developing PE projects require significant planning and direction, as well as training resources for workplace participants. Recognizing the need for comprehensive PE resources, the SafetyNet Centre for Occupational Health and Safety Research in Newfoundland & Labrador worked to develop a PE tool kit "A Team Approach". This package includes Promotional Video, Ergonomists Guide, Training Manual and associated Intervention Tools for development of knowledge and skills of Ergonomics Team members. This conference presentation outlines the tool kit and demonstrates the need to partner with other ergonomists to adapt and improve the tools in variety of other working contexts.

Session 104 | Palomino C/D Dr. Perry Sirota (sponsored by MHSA)

Mental Health in the Workplace

Mental Health in the workplace is attracting unprecedented attention, highlighted by the publication of the first ever Canadian national standard titled "Psychological health and safety in the workplace", document CAN/CSA-Z1003-13/BNQ 9700-803/2013, National Standard of Canada. About 15% of Canadians will experience a mental disorder each year, depression rates appear to be increasing, and most people at risk are of working age. 30% of disability claims and 70% of disability costs are for mental disorders. It is estimated that the annual cost of mental illness to the Canadian Workplace is \$50 billion. Approximately 500,000 Canadian workers miss work daily due to mental health issues. Not only is mental health highly treatable, accommodations in the workplace are highly effective, cost efficient, and untreated mental illness in the workplace represents a significant health and safety concern.

- · Symptoms associated with these disorders
- Defining and understanding stress
- Warning signs
- Economic and legal factors
- · Creating a healthy workplace
- Stigma and the mentally ill worker

Session 105 | Quarter Horse Diane Radnoff

Exposure to Crystalline Silica at Alberta Work Sites

Exposure to crystalline silica is a hazard common to many industries in Alberta. In 2009, the occupational exposure limit (OEL) for crystalline silica was lowered. Concern was expressed

on the ability of employers to comply with the limit, particularly when exposure limits were adjusted down for work shifts longer than eight hours.

Since there was little exposure data available for Alberta work sites, Alberta Human Services initiated a project to identify industries and tasks for which exposure to silica above the OEL is a potential hazard in Alberta and evaluate the controls in place to protect workers. Exposure monitoring was conducted over four years. The results of this work indicate that exposure to crystalline silica is more widespread than initially thought. In many cases where the OEL was exceeded, additional worker groups were exposed as a result of their specific work tasks or due to incidental exposure from other activities at the work site. In addition, many employers have controls in place to protect workers, but these controls are not used to their full potential. Finally, the OEL may not need to be adjusted to protect workers over work shifts longer than eight hours. The lessons learned are that more work is required to raise awareness of the hazard and to develop tools that can be used by employers and workers at the work site to help reduce exposures.

Respect in the Workplace - Why Respect Matters

Not only are costs a significant reason that respect matters in the workplace, employers are also required by the Canadian Human Rights Commission and Canada Labour Code to develop their own harassment policies and provide anti-harassment, bullying and discrimination training. Employers can be held legally responsible for harassment, bullying and discrimination in their workplaces, and unless they can prove that they are making efforts to prevent these occurrences from happening, may well find themselves facing serious financial and legal consequences. This session will explore ways to deal with harmful behaviours such as bullying and harassment in the workplace and look at concrete action steps that are part of a process to reduce the risk of violence and increase protection within the organization.

Session 107 | Quarter Horse Building Owners and Managers of Alberta - BOMA Partnerships

BOMA - PIR EHS Certificate

Occupational Health and Safety (Alberta Human Services) and BOMA have been working together to create a new environment, health and safety standards certification.

This joint certificate is designed to recognize building management companies whose managed buildings have reached BOMA's highest level of Building Environmental Standards in Level 4 Certification and where the management companies have also achieved a Certificate of Recognition (COR). The new joint certificate will recognize this significant achievement. This session will provide an overview of the path to achieving this new joint certificate while describing how BOMA BESt Level 4 Standard and the Certificate of Recognition fit together.

Session 108 | Palomino E Dr. Lisa Ross-Rodriguez (sponsored by Alberta Human Services)

Are there Mega-Risks of Nano-Materials?

Engineered Nano-materials (ENM) are produced to improve existing technologies and develop new applications for the advancement of many industry sectors, such as energy, medicine, consumer products, agriculture, and manufacturing. The rapid growth of the nanotechnology industry in Alberta brings new challenges to understanding, predicting, and handling potential occupational health and safety (OHS) risks.

This presentation will discuss the current ENM situation in Alberta and discuss recommendations for OHS regarding nanotechnology.

Session 109 | Palomino F Beverly Lafortune (sponsored by St. John Ambulance)

Saving Lives at Work, Home and Play

You've been trained and are prepared for emergencies at work but as we know, emergencies aren't scheduled to occur Monday to Friday, 9 to 5.

They can happen at any time, any place. Are you prepared for that? This session will provide participants the opportunity to reflect on their current knowledge and skills and explore strategies to transition their work emergency and First Aid plans for personal use.

Session 110 | Palomino C/D Greg Ford

The Link Between Personality and Human Error

Studies show that 80-90% of workplace incidents are caused by human error, and more than ever progressive organizations are putting a spotlight on the human aspect of the safety equation. This presentation focuses on the link between personality and high-risk behaviour, due to each person's core default settings of being Impulsive vs. Cautions, Rule-Resistant vs. Compliant, and so on.

The speaker will examine case studies and research findings on how organizations are decreasing incidents, reducing equipment damage, and lowering insurance costs. Specific results include a five times higher workplace incident rate for Impulsive personality types, and a four times higher road-crash rate for Rule Resistant personality types. Attendees will see data and findings from pilot projects with major Canadian corporations (EnCana, Finning, Ledcor, Kiewit Energy Canada, Canadian Freightways, SNC Lavalin, BCAA). This session will demonstrate that it may be possible to predict the probability of unsafe behaviours using ground breaking new employee evaluation techniques and is intended for forward-thinking business leaders who seek continuous improvement and who are open to new ideas.

Session 111 | Quarter Horse Allan Kehler

Thriving Versus Surviving in the Face of Addiction

It is important that we approach the area of addictions with understanding and compassion instead of judgment. Allan firmly believes that at the root of addiction lies a living problem that needs to be recognized and healed. The key to moving forward is having the tools to live.

When someone close to you is struggling with addictions, one can feel a sense of hopelessness. At a time when one feels as though everything is out of their own control, Allan can show you the steps to healing. He provides direction on how one can move forward from an unhealthy situation.

In the workplace, increased rates of accidents and injuries, absenteeism, and decreased team morale are all results of addictions. Allan will discuss the signs of addiction, how to approach this sensitive issue, and give the tools of intervention with a proactive approach. You will be taken into the world of an addict while being provided with a deeper understanding. An employer who is willing to take the time to put energy into their employees will benefit from increased productivity, less absenteeism and turnover, and higher team morale overall.

Worksafe Alberta

The goal of this project is to renew Work Safe Alberta through the development of a Government of Alberta Strategic Framework. This will align the efforts of the formal Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) branches (Policy, Program Development and Research, Occupational Disease Prevention, Delivery and Partnerships in Injury Reduction), and coordinate related GOA activities that affect health and safety in the workplace, positioning the GOA to better support employers and workers to prevent illnesses, injuries and fatalities at work

The strategy will be led by OHS with significant input from other ministries to look for opportunities where we can enhance and streamline services through strategic alliances for Albertans.

Sean will relate fatigue issues to real life examples such as the recent train accident in Quebec City. These examples will show the importance of leveraging actual validated science to demonstrate the real dangers workers are subjecting themselves and innocent bystanders to when they come to work tired. Wearable technology can help prevent these fatigue related accidents in the workplace.


